Many evangelicals strongly believe that the American Revolution was
 wholly justified, not only politically but biblically. They believe that the
 rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness not only are divinely
 endowed but that their attainment and defense somehow is Christian
 and thereby justified at whatever cost, including that of armed
 rebellion when necessary. Obviously, such action is forbidden by God,
 and, judged in light of our present text, it is equally obvious that the
 United States was born out of violation of Scripture.
